Philip II Gold Stater Choice Extremely Fine —

This exceptional Gold Stater of Philip II of Macedon struck during his lifetime or shortly after his death (359-336 BC), is a rare and historically significant artifact from one of the most powerful rulers of the ancient world. Struck from the vast wealth acquired through Macedon's gold mines, these staters played a crucial role in funding Philip's military campaigns.

S.S. Republic Seated Liberty Half Dollars NGC

Shipwreck Effect — Austin Rare Coins just acquired a group of remarakably nice shipwreck silver coins from the SS Republic. This group of Civil-War Era Seated Liberty Silver Half Dollars, dated between 1854 and 1860, offers collectors an affordable entry point into historic U.S. coinage from a prominent shipwreck.

1753 Mexico 8 Reale NGC Mint State-60 — Immerse yourself in the rich history of Spanish colonial coinage with the 1753 Mexico 8 Reale. Issued during the reign of King Ferdinand VI of Spain, this coin emphasizes his authority over the Spanish territories in the New World. This large silver coin is stunning and impressive in hand, with great luster, crisp detail on both sides, and a perfect strike. Only one available for \$2,095.



54 B.C. Coson "Brutus" Gold Stater Choice Uncirculated

These fascinating Coson gold staters struck over 2,100 years have been a mystery since a large hoard was found in Transylvania in 1543, and to this day, there are different opinions on where and why they were issued. The most prevalent is that they were struck around 43 B.C. by Marcus Junius Brutus (assassin of Julius Caesar) to defend the Republic against forces loyal to the assassinated Caesar. Byzantine Justinian II Gold Solidus NGC Mint State 5x3 /

This remarkable gold solidus was struck during the first reign of Justinian II, one of the most fascinating rulers of the Byzantine Empire. The obverse features one of the earliest numismatic depictions of Christ, shown facing with a cross behind his head is a powerful statement of the empire's Christian identity. The reverse depicts Emperor Justinian II, standing and holding a cross potent, underscoring both his authority and devotion. Only one is available for \$6,687



1591/0 Seville, Spain 2 Escudo NGC Mint State 63 —

This rare 1591 Spanish Gold Cob 2 Escudo hails from the Seville Mint and holds the distinction of being the only certified example from this year, graded in exceptional Mint State 63 condition by NGC. Struck during the reign of King Philip II of Spain, this historical coin reflects Spain's global influence and economic strength during the 16th century. This amazingly high-grade example is the only certified example of this issue in any condition, making it totally unique! Only one available for \$8,400



<u>1762 Colombia 8 Escudo PCGS About Unc. 53</u> —

This large gold coin was issued around 250 years ago and is literally one of only FOUR examples known in all grades between PCGS and NGC combined! Coins don't get much rarer than this, and certainly not for this kind of money. Minted in Colombia in 1762, this 8 Escudo coin showcases the exceptional craftsmanship of the era. Its design features intricate details that transport us back to the colonial period, evoking images of a bygone era and the grandeur of the Spanish Empire.

Marcus Aurelius Gold Aureus Choice Ext. Fine in

Fine Style — This impressive gold aureus was issued under Marcus Aurelius who ruled from 161-180 A.D. His reign was marked by intellectual achievement and prolonged military campaigns on Rome's frontiers. This coin has remarkable detail for the grade and is well struck and centered. Roman gold in fine style is seldom encountered in any condition and brings a premium when sold. Available for \$17,950.
